Sundays: Beginning March 5

On the five Sundays in Lent we will explore the powerful stories in this Year A cycle of readings beginning with the Temptation of Jesus in the Wilderness and continuing through Jesus' encounters with people in search of the life he alone can give: Nicodemus (John 3), The Samaritan Woman (John 4), The Man born Blind (John 9), and finally Lazarus (John 11). More will be said about Holy Week and Easter (April 9-15) in the April Lamb's Tale.

Item: Ministry Opportunities - Can You help?

For several years now after taking over from Andrea M., Dave Jarvis has been in charge of cashing in our can, bottle and plastic recycling. The proceeds from his efforts are donated to the ELCA World Hunger Appeal. Now that Dave is leaving (see above) we are looking for someone else to take charge of the recycling ministry. If you think you might want to do this, let me know.

And, in addition, Andrea M. will no longer be doing nursery care and children's education during worship. If you feel called to do this ministry, then let me know. Until we get someone to take that job, there will be no nursery care available.

Item: Riverbed Homeless Community Update

Many of you are aware that much is changing in the homeless community along the Santa Ana Riverbed where we have been serving a hot lunch every Sunday for almost 7 years. The people living in that large encampment are being evicted. We don't know yet what the final result of all this will be or how it will affect our ministry. We do know that as a result we have lost one of our partner groups. And due to other logistical needs we will have to find a different location to serve the meal - probably as soon as sometime later this month. As all these changes unfold, please keep this ministry in your prayers for God to guide our next steps wisely and especially to be with those in the homeless community who are suffering eviction and dislocation as well as loss of personal property. It is an especially hard time for them.

Schedule for Wednesdays in Lent 2017

7pm following Lenten Soup Suppers in Luther Hall

This Lenten Season in conjunction with the *Reformation 500 Commemoration Year* we will be using *Martin Luther's Small Catechism* as the theme for our Wednesday services.

March 1 – **Ash Wednesday:** Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion – *“Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.”*

March 8 – Week 1 of Lent: **The Ten Commandments**

In Exodus God gives Moses the Law so the people of Israel would know how to fulfill their part of God's Covenant as God's people.

March 15 – Week 2 of Lent: **The Apostle's Creed**

How do we express belief? How do we share our faith? The Creed, crafted in the early days of the church, gives us a simple but firm foundation for sharing and professing.

March 22 – Week 3 of Lent: **The Lord's Prayer**

Lent and Lenten worship call us to repent and make a new beginning. One of the best ways to begin again with God is through prayer. And what better prayer than the one Jesus taught us?

March 29 – Week 4 of Lent: **Baptism**

Dying to our old sinful self in Baptism we rise from the waters as beloved children of God. We are walking wet through the forty days of Lent, reminded daily that we are dead to sin.

April 5 – Week 5 of Lent: **Holy Communion**

As we approach Holy Week we remember Jesus' sacrifice for us. We gather around the table to remind ourselves and one another of that sacrifice and how it shapes our lives.

Note: Holy Week begins April 9.
